(Shelemiah the priest and Zadak the scribe and of the Levites, Pedaish)

Who was next to them?

(Hanan)

Why?

(They were considered faithful)

What was their task?

(To distribute to their brethren)

13:14

What was Nehemiah's prayer?

(Remember me, O my God, concerning this, and do not wipe out my good deeds that I have done for the house of my God, and for its services!)

13:15

In those days he saw people in Judah bringing many Things into Jerusalem on the Sabbath day-what did he do?

(warned them about the day on which they were selling provisions)

13:16

Who else was selling goods there?

(men of Tyre)

13:17

Who was it that Nehemah contended with?

(The Nobles of Judah)

13:18

What did he say to them?

(Did not your fathers do this and did not our God bring all this disaster on us and on this city?
Yet you bring added wrath on Israel by profaning the sabbath!)

13:19

As it began to turn dark, what did he command to be done?

(the gate to be shut, and charged that they must not be opened till after the Sabbath)

What else?

(He posted some servants at the gates, so that no burdens would be brought in on the sabbath day)

13:20

Where did the merchants and sellers of wares lodge?

(Outside Jerusalem)

13:21

What did he say to them when he warned them?

(why do you spend the night around the wall? If you do so again, I will lay hands on you!)

Then what happened?

(from that time on they came no more on the Sabbath)

13:22

What did he command the Levites?

(that they should cleanse themselves, and that they should go and guard the gates, to sanctify the Sabbath day)

What else did he pray?

(Remember me, O my God, concerning this also, and spare me according to the greatness of Your mercy)

What did he see in those days?

(Jews who had married women of Ashdad, Ammon and Moab)

13:24

What Language did half of their children speak?

(the language of Ashdad and could Not speak the language of Judah but spoke according to the Language of one or the other people)

When he contended with them, what did he do and say?

(Cursed them, stuck some of them and pulled out their hair and made them swear by God, saying, you shall not give your daughters as wives to their sons, nor take their daughters for your sons or yourselves")

Though beloved of God; and God made him King over all Israel-what caused even him to sin?

(pagan women)

When did Nehemiah not want to hear of them doing?

(Transgressing against our God by marrying Pagan women)

(cleansed them of everything pagan and assigned duties to the priests and the Levites, each to his service)

And what else?
